Statement of Need:

Elder abuse in the form of forced compliance with daily cares such as bathing and dressing, catheterization, or neglect in the form of failure to achieve hygiene or manage incontinence in aged persons with dementia in residential care facilities is a major problem in CNFs today.

Practice Gap:

Training programs for healthcare providers in certified nursing facilities directly addressing these real-world issues are currently lacking.

Learning Objectives

Upon completion of this educational activity, participants will be able to:

- Describe and diagnose common causes of continence disorders.
- Discuss alternatives to catheterization and medical needs for such interventions.
- Demonstrate skills in the management of daily hygiene in aged persons with dementia.

Expected Outcome:

Utilizing a series of cases, participants will demonstrate newly acquired skills in the diagnosis and management of issues relating to incontinence or resistance to hygiene care in the aging population with degenerative dementia. These newly acquired skills will result in improved management and care of incontinence or resistance to hygiene care that can have

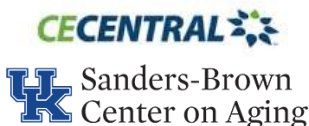
